
OUR HISTORY

In 1952, Trinity Catholic School opened its doors as Blessed Sacrament School to 102 students in 1st – 4th Grades. The school consisted of a one-building attachment to Blessed Sacrament Church and was known locally as "The Reading School." Three Dominican Sisters from Adrian, Michigan, pioneered the fledgling school. Enrollment doubled just one year after opening.

Today, Trinity Catholic School enjoys a rich history and tradition of excellence. For over 70 years now, our graduates have made lasting contributions to the greater Tallahassee community and beyond.

2. Apply!

Requirements for Application:

- Complete an online application available at www.trinityknights.org/apply
- \$300 New Student Enrollment Fee (\$700 Max Per Family) (A portion of the Enrollment Fee is non-refundable)
- Report card from 2023-2024 school year
- Florida Immunization Certificate (DH Form 680)
- Florida School Entry Health Exam (DH Form 3040)
 - *Student health physical and immunization forms MUST be dated within the last calendar year and received BEFORE your student can start school
 - *Religious exemptions not accepted.
- Participating Catholics: submit Parish Voucher form to your parish's office.

3. Student Shadow & Screening

Shadow days are required for rising 2nd-8th Graders.

Screenings are required for rising K-8th Graders with the Guidance Counselor on Shadow Day or by appointment.

4. Acceptance

Acceptance letter will be emailed after review of completed application.

5. Sign up on FACTS

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Early Bird Supervision

Early Bird Supervision (EBS) provides beforeschool supervision for students that need to arrive on campus prior to 7:30 a.m.
EBS starts at 7:00 a.m. - No students may be left on campus before that time. Please make sure your child eats breakfast before arriving on campus.

Students are encouraged to read, study, bring cards to play solitaire, or a Rubik cube, a coloring book, etc.

Beyond the Bell

Beyond the Bell (BTB) is an after-school program designed to meet your child's needs for afternoon activities and afford you the peace of mind knowing that your child is safe and having fun with his or her school friends with BTB counselors right on the Trinity Catholic School campus. BTB begins when the school day ends and runs until 6:00p.m.

Monthly & Drop-In Fees will be billed through FACTS Tuition Management on a 9 month billing schedule from Sept. - May.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Trinity Catholic School is dedicated to ensuring that a Catholic education of excellence remains accessible to all families desiring it for their children, regardless of income. Our goal is to keep tuition rates as low as possible, while ensuring the fiscal soundness and growth of our school.

Though the actual cost of education per child is over \$10,000 per year, our tuition rates are much less due to parish support, benefactors, and fundraising. As a result, Trinity's tuition is lower overall than other comparable faith-based, private schools in the area.

In an effort to reduce the financial burden for families to receive a high-quality, private education, Trinity Catholic School accepts the following state scholarships:
